Traffic incidents have an immediate impact on transportation operations, including a reduction in the reliability of services and an increase in risk for responders. As much as 25 percent of all roadway delays are the result of traffic incidents.

In addition to billions of dollars in wasted fuel and productivity, traffic incidents represent a significant danger to responders and motorists. The likelihood that a secondary and more severe crash will occur in backup increases every minute that travel lanes remain blocked.

Successful and safe quick clearance requires advanced training and coordination involving all responding disciplines. Quick clearance means lowered risks for personnel and reduced chances for additional wrecks.
